

Projects > Flower Wall Hanging

Brighten up any room in the house with this gorgeous and vibrant flower wall hanging!

Materials and Supplies

- [Brother Innov-Is NX-2000 Laura Ashley Limited Edition Sewing Machine](#)
- [Brother Lightweight Tear-Away Stabilizer](#)
- [Brother Circular Sewing Attachment](#)
- [Brother Ruffler Foot](#)
- ½ yd of orange batik fabric
- ¼ yd of dark pink batik fabric
- 3 shades of green batik fabric ½ yd each
- Scalloped edge rotary cutter
- Straight edge rotary cutter
- Sewing thread to match fabrics
- 2mm silk ribbon
- Bobbin for bobbin work
- Large cover button kit



Instructions

1. Cut strips of orange and pink batik fabric. Use the straight rotary cutter to cut one side and the scalloped rotary cutter to cut the other side.
2. Cut a piece of green fabric 14" x 14".
3. Stitch the orange strips together to form one long strip.

4. Stitch the pink strips together to form one long strip.
5. Attach the ruffle foot to the machine.
6. Adjust the ruffle and the machine to make a tuck ever sixth stitch.
7. Select a straight stitch in the center. Shorten the stitch length.
8. Sew the orange fabric placing the straight edge in the ruffle.

9. Adjust the ruffle to ruffle every stitch and ruffle the pink strip on the straight side.
10. Remove the ruffle foot and attach the circular sewing foot to the machine.
11. Place a piece of stabilizer on the wrong side of the 14" x 14" fabric.
12. Find the middle of the fabric and place the pin of the circular attachment in the center and place in the hole of the circular sewing attachment.



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13. Set the circular sewing attachment to stitch a large circle. (The sample set on 115 for a very large circle.)
14. Attach the "J" foot to the machine.
15. Using the left edge of the "J" foot attach the ruffle to the background (green) fabric. Overlap the end of the ruffle with the beginning.
16. Stitch another row using a smaller circle setting (90). The ruffles should overlap each other covering up the previous stitching.
17. Stitch three rows of orange ruffles. The third row is on setting (65).
18. Stitch the pink ruffles at (40) and (30).
19. Arrange the last ruffle in a circle. Attach the very last ruffle (center ruffle) without the circle sewing attachment. **See Figure #3**
20. Cut a 4" square of pink fabric for the center.
21. Cut a 4" square of stabilizer.
22. Place the stabilizer on the wrong side of the fabric.
23. Hand wind a bobbin with the 2mm silk ribbon.
24. Place the bobbin in the extra bobbin and adjust the bobbin to handle the silk ribbon. Test on a scrap fabric before sewing on the pink fabric.
25. Place the fabric wrong side up with the stabilizer on that side.
26. Select a decorative stitch; pull the bobbin (silk ribbon) up to the top side. Both the bobbin and the top stitch should be on the stabilizer side. Stitch a row of decorative stitches.
27. Select another decorative stitch and stitch next to the previous stitches.
28. Stitch several rows of decorative stitches. Until the 4" square is complete or until the fabric created will cover the button.
29. Use the embellished fabric to cover the button and stitch in the center of the last row of ruffles. **See Figure #4**
30. Cut other shades of green fabric and piece together in a random pattern.
31. Embellish using heavy decorative threads and silk ribbon in the bobbin to form the stem of the flower.
