As a fashion designer, I am always looking for new tools to help take my creativity to the next level. The Brother™ ScanNCut allows me to do just that with its ability to allow me to easily cut unique designs to embellish clothing with.

MATERIALS:

Brother™ ScanNCut machine, T-shirt, fabric, iron-on fabric appliqué contact sheet

step 1.

Find a T-shirt, tank, maxi dress, etc., of your choice. It can be store-bought or you can make your own!



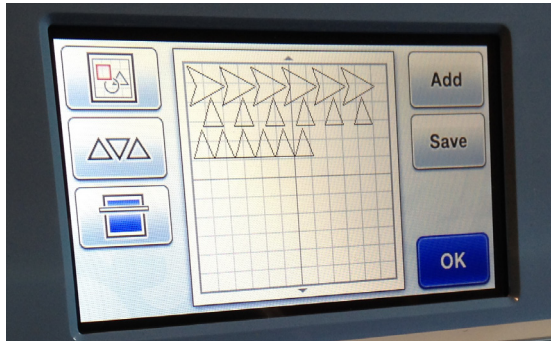
step 2.

Choose a medium-sized triangle shape of your choice. Adjust the size according to the proportions of your garment. Select an even number to duplicate as many as you like. The more shapes, the more options you will have to create a great mosaic pattern.

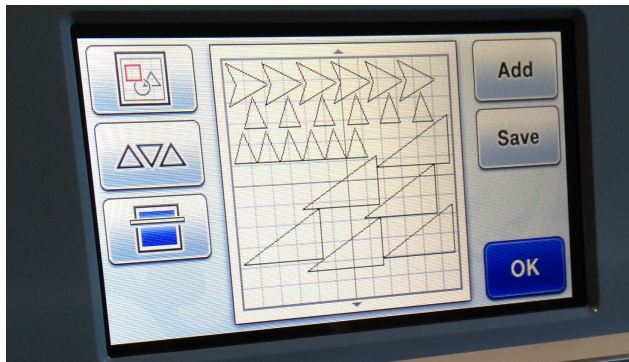


step 3.

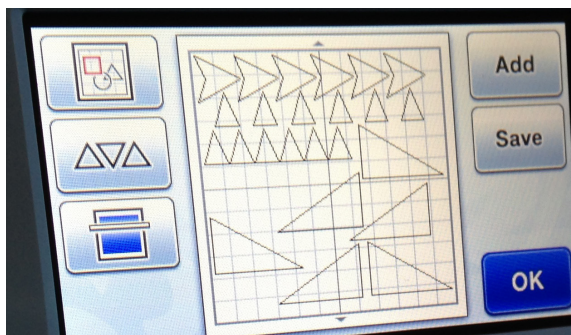
Choose a small-sized triangle shape of your choice. Once again, adjust the size according to the proportions of your garment. Select an even number to duplicate that is more than what you selected for the medium triangles. Creating smaller pieces will allow your design to have greater detail.

**step 4.**

Choose a large-sized triangle shape of your choice, and adjust the size according to the proportions of your garment. Select an even number to duplicate that is less than what you selected for the medium triangles. These will serve as your anchors and focal points in your design, so not as many are needed.

**step 5.**

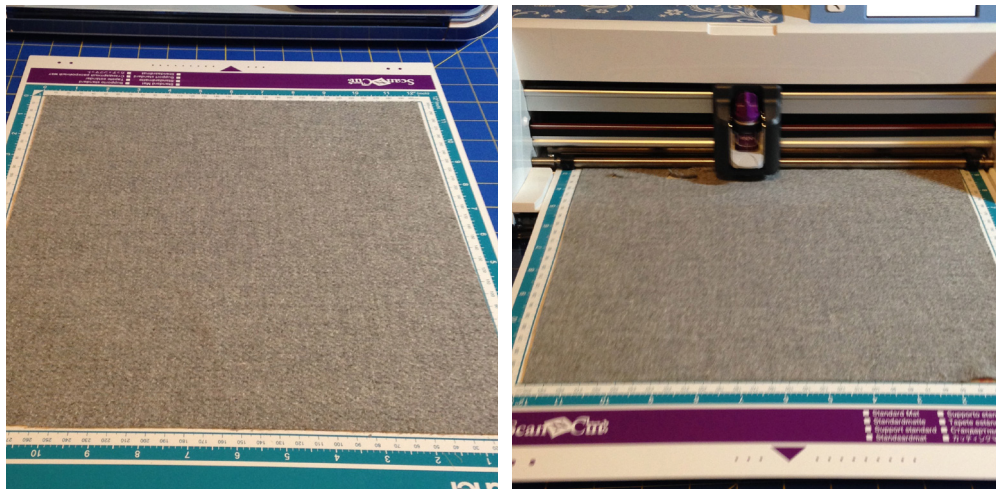
If you have chosen any triangle pieces that are not symmetrical, you will need to mirror half of the number that you selected for each size. This will allow you to create a mirrored, symmetrical design on your garment.



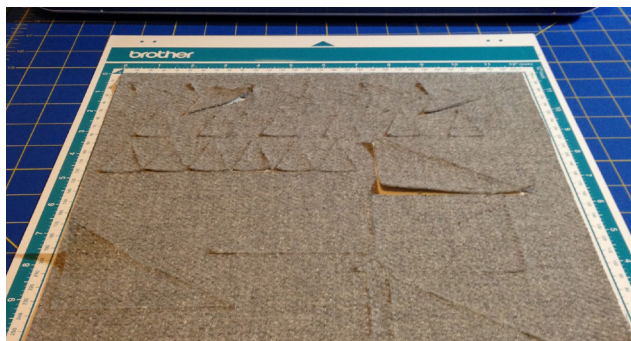
step 6. With a fabric of your choice, cut a square to fit the entire size of the mat.



step 7. Place your fabric onto the standard mat firmly and feed into the machine.



step 8. Select "Cut" and let your ScanNCut machine do its magic!



step 9.

Remove the mat from the machine carefully so you don't pull any pieces from your fabric.



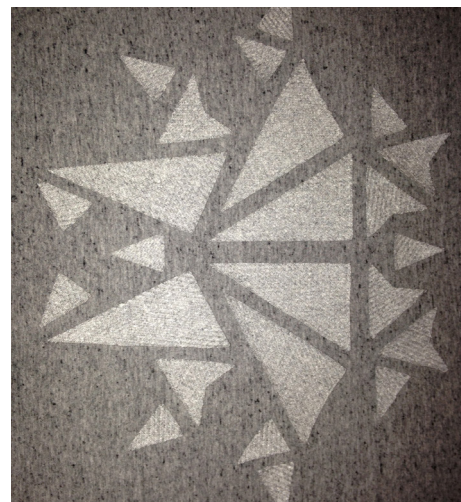
step 10.

Peel away all cut pieces.



step 11.

Now the fun begins! Create a pattern on your selected garment. (I have mirrored mine to resemble a Native American motif.) Peel away the backing from each triangular piece and iron onto your garment.



step 12. Your garment is complete!
